HEID'S—A CENTRAL NEW YORK LANDMARK

Not far from the site of Waterfest '88 there's an historical landmark that should be visited before leaving the Liverpool area. It's Heid's, a little red and yellow restaurant that looks like it was straight out of "Happy Days" and known to generations of Central New Yorkers as THE hot dog stand. When skies are clear and the sun is warm and bright, there's no meal in town that can compete with the simple pleasure of a Heid's hot dog and a beverage, topped off with a dessert from Heid's Sweet Treats old fashioned ice cream parlor just across the parking lot.

Sweet Treats is a relatively new addition to this tradition known as Heid's but it's definitely in keeping with the yester-year flavor of the whole operation. Its charming decor creates an atmosphere of relaxation where you can enjoy a refreshing light lunch and extend your pleasure with a dessert made with Heid's own smooth, rich gourmet ice cream.

In time, Sweet Treats may become as well known as the hot dog stand which was started 36 years before the IRA Regatta was first rowed on Onondaga Lake!

The menu at the hot dog stand is very simple, allowing for a quick choice—and any choice at Heid's is the right one. Open from 6 a.m. to 1 a.m. daily the stand offers single coneys or franks, grilled as you order, and served on a fresh bun. Soft drinks, beer, chocolate milk and a varied selection of snack foods just about complete the menu. Condiment choices are also simplified (or should we say "restricted"?) since Heid's offers only mustard to its hot dog customers. "You just CAN'T put ketchup on a coney," explains Helen Heid Platner, current owner and daughter of Valentine Heid, the hot dog stand's founder.

The present building was erected in 1931 and remodeled after Val Heid's visit to the 1939 World's Fair. That's where the idea for the "art nouveau" architecture came from which makes Heid's a classic today. Mrs. Platner helped out in the business as a child and began running the business in 1978. She's proud of Heid's popularity and its place in the community. "Heid's is unique", she says, "and it won't change as long as I am here".

The tradition of family ownership and management continues today as it has for over a hundred years. Heid's celebrated their centennial in 1986. Recently daughter Susan Platner entered the business in an active role. "In spite of some success in an unrelated business field, I always felt an almost magnetic pull to this family enterprise. It's extremely fulfilling to me to be able to continue the tradition", she says.

Find out for yourself why visitors to the Syracuse area ask to go to Heid's...why locals wait in line of any length to enjoy a simple hot dog...why Heid's has become a tradition that has survived the Great Depression, World War II and even Rock and Roll. And while you're there, pick up a T-shirt or a coffee mug or some other memento that proves that you, too, enjoyed the "Greatest hot dog in Central New York!"
